Step 1: Download map from American Memory

- Locate a map in the American Memory collections. (Tip: Use the browse categories on the American Memory homepage and click on maps.)
 - Click on the thumbnail image of the map on its bibliographic record.
 - Right click on the [Download MrSID image](#) link or the [Download JPEG 2000](#) link.
 - Choose Save Target As.
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Step 2: Open map in MrSID viewer (a plug-in for Internet Explorer)

- Browse to locate the map file to open.
 - To open the map: Right click, and choose open with *Internet Explorer* (you may also be able to simply double click on the file).
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Step 3: Navigate the viewer

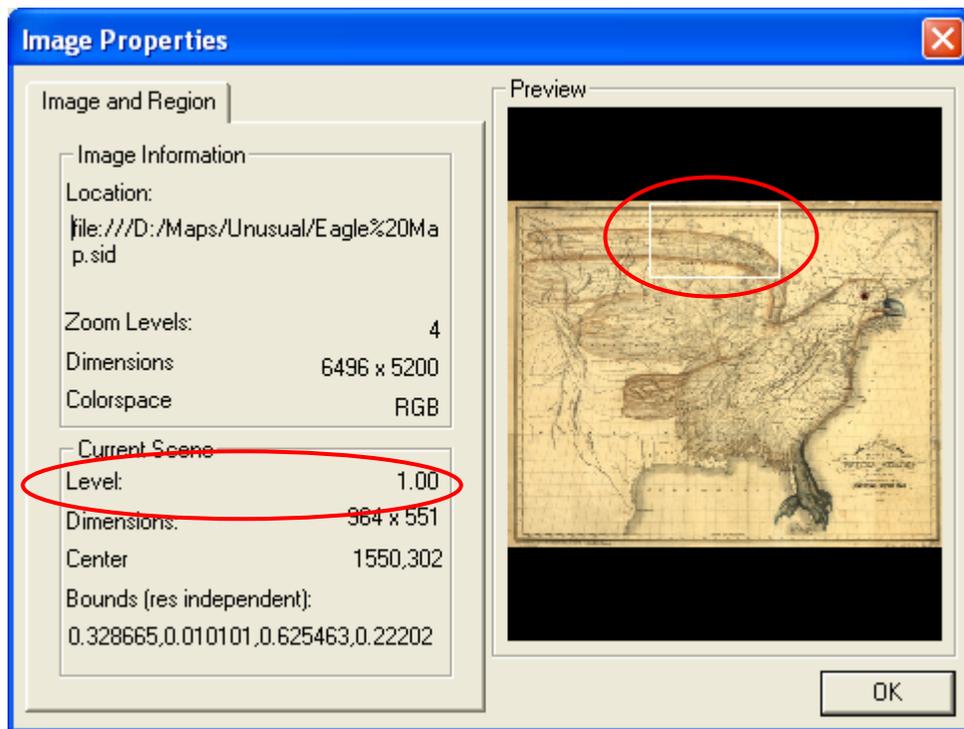


Familiarize yourself with the toolbar icons (left to right)



Step 3: Adjust the Map for Printing

- Move the marker on the Zoom bar to the appropriate zoom level for your map.
- Click the **Image Info**  button and view the Level measurement (when you print, you will want to look for a zoom level with sections that appear to be about two to three (8.5 x 14) pages across...maybe Level 1 or 2)
- If needed, again use the Zoom Bar to zoom in or out the appropriate number of levels.

Step 3: Print a Map (continued)

- Adjust the white preview box to select the upper left-hand corner of map. NOTE: Be sure to select some of the black area outside map border when working with edges.
- Click **OK**.
- Click on **File, Print**. Choose **Preferences**, then set the paper to landscape and to legal size (8.5 x 14). Click **OK**.
- To print the next section, click **Image Info** button to open the preview window to move the white preview box to the next section, being sure to have some overlap between sections.
- Repeat the above directions until you have printed all sections of map
NOTE: Be sure to complete all map printing before closing the map file.

Step 4: Assembling the Map

- Be sure to lay out your sections as you print to be sure you don't leave any sections out
 - Cut unwanted edges with scissors or paper cutter
 - Tape sections together
 - Use the map gridlines and details to help line up sections
 - To make map look more realistic, tape sections together on the backside instead of the front
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
